Practice your addition flash cards. | Use 3D (solid shapes) objects from around the house and describe where they are using position words (ex: next to, below, above, beside, in front of - The ball (sphere) is next to the chair.) | Solve these addition sentences, use pennies or beans to help: 8+2= 5+1= 6+2= 4+0= 1+1= 3+4= 2+5= 1+3= | Play the game of go fish with a deck of cards. Deal 7 cards to each person put the extra in the middle. Ask another player for a card you need a match to. If they have the card they give it to you, if not they go fish into the pile of cards in the middle. The person with the most matches wins. | Take a walk outside, name different shapes in nature.
